This is Vermont's state quarter. It shows a person getting sap.



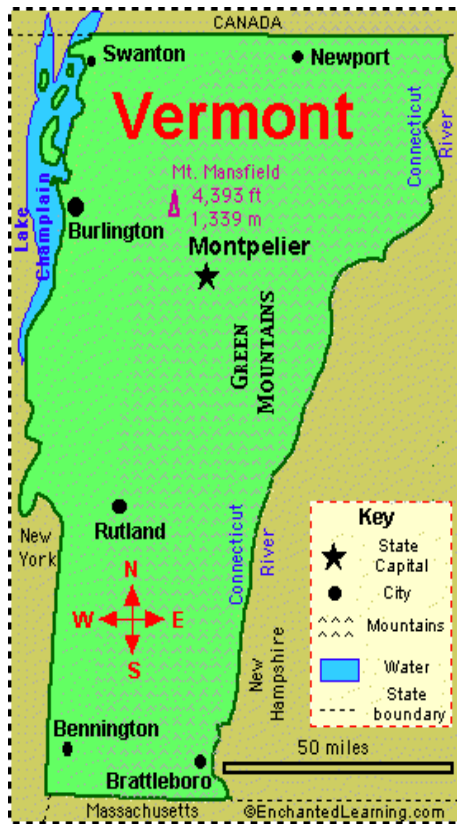
More than half the trees on Mount Philo lost their crowns.
